English:

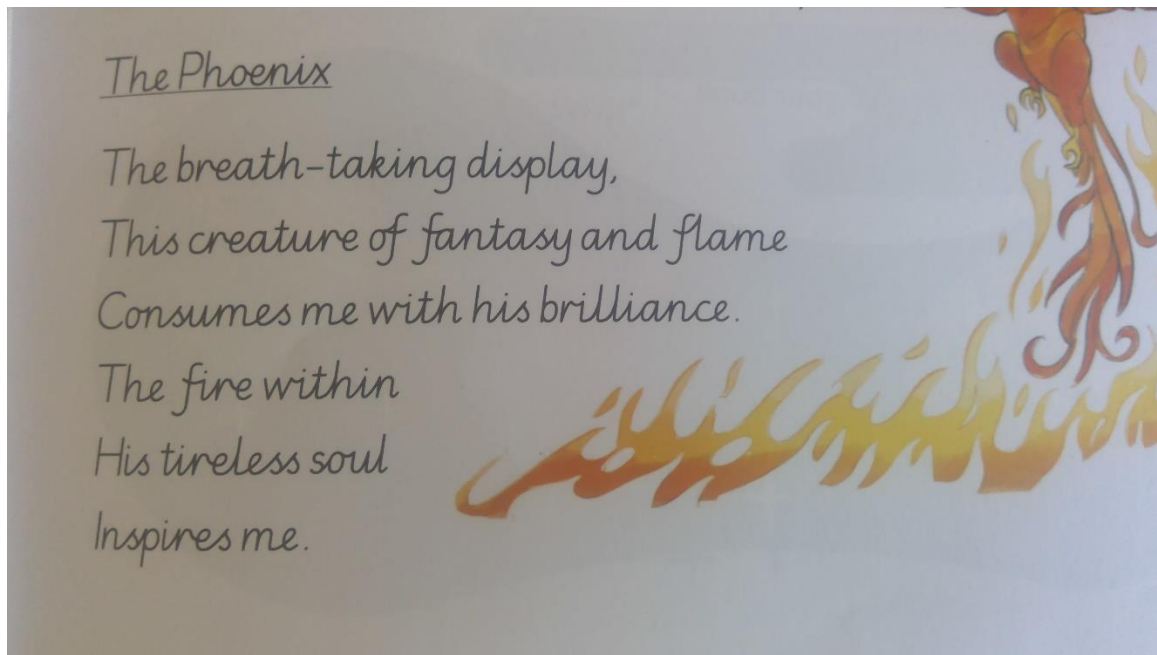
LO: Understand how language choices can change and enhance meaning.

RE:

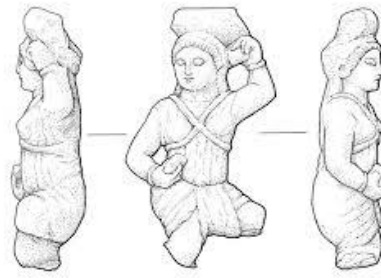
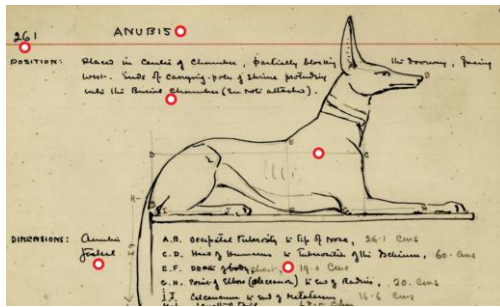
LO: to understand that we are holy people.
