English tasks:

- Create a newspaper report about the day you were born- include weather on the day, stories in the news, etc. Can you find any famous people who were born on that day?
- Explore the Oxford Owl website and read some ebooks! It's free to sign up.

- Create a blurb for the book you are reading. Why should people read it? Remember not to give too much away!
- **Birthdays should not be celebrated.** Do you agree or disagree with the statement? Justify your opinion using facts. Think back to when we wrote discussion texts at school. Remember to use connectives!
- Create your own word search. The theme of this should be "NHS". Ask a family member to complete it. Send your word searches in to the Year 6 email address for us to complete!

Maths Tasks:

- Join Miss Anthoney and Mr Howard for a Live Mathletics competition on Tuesday at 10am! Who can beat the teachers?
- Complete the Mathletics tasks set by your teacher.
- Continue working on your CGP workbooks.
- Convert items of food found at home into grams and kg! Remember the Maths masters song...There's a 1000g in a kilogram! Kilo =1000.
- Ask your Mum or Dad what you are going to have for dinner one night. Write down
 the recipe they are using (or what's on the back of the packet) and the quantities of
 each ingredient. For a challenge, convert these quantities from g to KG, ml to L and
 write both units. Write a list of the ingredients in your home learning book.

'Other' Tasks:

RE: Jesus appeared to his disciples on a number of occasions after the Resurrection. He greeted them, shared food with them and then he sent them out to continue the message of the Good News. Luke tells how, after his Resurrection, Jesus reassures his disciples that they will not be alone.

Then he said to them 'These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you – that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, the prophets and the psalms must be fulfilled'. Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures and he said to them, "Thus it is

written that the Messiah will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance and forgiveness

of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to these things. And see, I am sending upon you what my Father promised; so stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high."

In Matthew, Jesus is not only reassuring the disciples but telling of their future mission

The eleven disciples went to the hill in Galilee where Jesus had told them to go. When they saw him they worshipped him even though some of them doubted. Jesus drew near and said to them, "I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth. Go then to all peoples everywhere and make them my disciples. Baptise them in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit and teach them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And I will be with you always to the end of the age."

Write an eye witness account as one of the disciples.

Show understanding of the account by making links to the Scripture and your experience and feelings of the events.

Geography: Research Mexican cities and find the eight largest throughout the country. Write down their population and where they are in the country. Once this is done, write a paragraph explaining which City you find the most interesting and why.

Science: Research Electricity and take notes as you are going. Create two postetrs. One will explain the dangers of electricity and how important it is to use electricity safely. The other poster will be based on how important electricity is both inside and outside of the house.

PSHE: Following on from last weeks task, research how 'pen pals' have become friends in real life. Write a poem about friendship (four lines in four stanzas) with the theme being that although you may be away from your friends and some of your family your feelings for them don't and haven't changed.

Art: Compare and contrast Mexico to its closest Neighbour, the United States of America! Draw the two countries side by side with an accurate scale (meaning size) and portrayal of how large Mexico is compared to the USA. Colour this in make

DT: Plan and create a plate of food that represents Mexico. Look at traditional Mexican food and how it is put into dishes to add flavour and colour. If you don't have any Mexican food, symbolise it by cutting objects out, colouring and sticking them onto a plastic plate.
