Growing Up



- Year 6 is an important year and we ask children to be responsible. We also expect them to set an example to the younger pupils in our school. We expect them to be role models.
- Your child only needs to bring a mobile phone to school if they are travelling home on their own, please ensure these are turned off.
- Year 6's *cannot* take a sibling home.
- Please ensure they don't bring nuts in we are a nut free school. Traces are fine if not avoidable. On birthdays, please make sure individually wrapped sweet treats only are brought in.
 - If your child is going home alone then please write a letter/email to your child's class teacher telling us.

We *cannot* let them go without this.


Attendance

- Year 6 is an important year and we want to make sure that we make the most of every opportunity. Please ensure your child is in school every day and on time.
- If your child's attendance is lower than 95% this is a cause for concern that the school will need to address with you.



Punctuality

- Please make sure your child arrives on time, they should be ready to enter the school gates at 8.45.
- We prepare morning work every day which aids your child's learning, please make sure they do not miss out.



PE Arrangements

PE is an essential part of the curriculum; please ensure your child has their PE kit in school, no earrings are allowed during PE lessons. Both classes have P.E. on a Monday and Friday.

<u>Homework</u>

Homework is an important part of your child's learning and is an opportunity for you to get involved in their school work. Please make sure your child is completing the tasks, and if you are helping them please could you make a note on the homework. All homework will be given out on **Friday** and needs to be returned for the following **Tuesday.** Topic based homework will be due in every half term.

Reading

Even though at this stage your child will becoming a competent reader, it is still important that your child reads regularly, both alone and to an adult, please sign the reading records to support this. Reading regularly improves fluency and accuracy and develops good comprehension skills. We will also be asking the children to create topic based projects each half term.

Raising Standards.

As part of our commitment to raising standards your child will be involved in formal end of year assessments in the form of SATs. We try to make these as stress free as possible and with commitment from ourselves, the children and you we can all strive to fulfil each child's potential.

There will also be **Booster Classes starting after Christmas holidays** for certain groups in both Maths and Reading, where children will be invited to attend once we have assessed what help is needed. In support of this please work with your child to ensure that they know all their multiplication tables and division facts, as this is a big boost in helping to learn more difficult concepts in Maths.

<u>SATs</u>

Your child will be assessed in Reading, Writing, Maths and Grammar.

At the end of the academic year, you will receive your child's end of Key Stage 2 results.

These are presented as :

Working towards the national standard
Working at the national standard
Working at greater depth within the national standard.

Scaled Scores

• A scaled score of 100 will always represent the 'national standard'.

- Each pupil's raw test score will therefore be converted into a scaled score on the scale ranging from 80 to 120.
- A child who achieves the 'national standard' (a score of 100) will be judged to have demonstrated sufficient knowledge in the areas assessed by the tests.
- At the end of the year each pupil will receive:
 - OA raw score (number of raw marks awarded).
 - OA scaled score in each tested subject.
 - Confirmation of whether or not they attained the national standard.




Reading

There are many ways in which you can support your child with their reading. Listening to your child read can take many forms.

- First and foremost, focus developing an enjoyment and love of reading.
- Enjoy stories together reading stories to your child at KS1 and KS2 is equally as important as listening to your child read.
- Read a little at a time but often, rather than rarely but for long periods of time!
- Talk about the story before, during and afterwards discuss the plot, the characters, their feelings and actions, how it makes you feel, predict what will happen and encourage your child to have their own opinions.
 - Look up definitions of words together you could use a dictionary, the internet or an app on a phone or tablet.
 - All reading is valuable it doesn't have to be just stories. Reading can involve anything from fiction and non-fiction, poetry, newspapers, magazines, football programmes, TV guides.

• Visit the local library - it's free!



Maths

- During the first half term we will be focusing on number and place value, addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, decimals and geometry.
- Please encourage your child to log in to Mathletics every week as we will be setting tasks based on what has been taught during that week. Login details are inside your child's reading record. Mathletics is a fantastic resource so please take the opportunity to use it.





Writing

Writing at St. Peter's.

Writing is not tested through a SAT's paper. Instead, this will be assessed by your child's class teacher at the end of the year with all of their writing being assessed, graded and moderated.

We particularly focus on individual skills that they learn in Year 6 and how they put these into extended pieces of writing throughout the year.

Judging the standard they are writing at throughout the whole year makes sure that every child achieves exactly what they are capable of and that they leave St. Peter's as good a writer as possible.

PSHE: RSE Curriculum

- The Year 6 curriculum includes sex education and we use the Catholic Scheme TentTen Life to the full to cover this topic.
- You do have the right to withdraw their child from these lessons, but we strongly advise not to as this is a very important topic and is very sensitively handled.
- To withdraw your child you need to make an appointment with the Headteacher to discuss further.
