Year 1 Home Learning Tasks

Week beginning: 30th March 2020

English tasks:

• Task 1

Look at the picture provided and answer these inference questions. Remember that inference means to look for clues within the picture!

- What time of year could it be and why?
- 2. How does the girl feel and why?
- 3. Who might the girl be giving the present to and why?
- 4. What might be inside the present? Why do you think that?



Look at the picture provided and have your child 'write in role' as one of the people. They need to pretend to be that person and use the first person (I, me, my). Have them write about how they are feeling and what they are thinking. As a challenge, have them use the conjunctions 'because, so, but' to explain their feelings.



Task 3

Write ten sentences containing words with the 'ing' suffix e.g. jumping, running, opening. Try to make them interesting!

Task 4

Have your child practice writing the following tricky words: school, push, pull, there, were, friend, school, said, house, could. Then, have them write a sentence for each word.

Task 5

Have your child look at the sentences below and correct the spelling mistakes in red. Have them write the corrected sentences into their book.

Each day please also complete handwriting practise and phonics activities.

- Handwriting: Throughout this week please practise all 'ladder letters': l, i, t, u, j, y. You need to write each letter lots of times to practise it. Make sure you start and finish the letter in the correct place.
- Phonics: Use the 'Phonics Play' website you can access free games for your children. We are working on phase 5 in school but if your child finds this too challenging please choose phase 3 or 4 instead. - Phonics: Use the 'Phonics Play' website to read some of their decodable comics. Try and read 1-2 at a time so you have others to look forward to! We are working on phase 5 in school but if your child finds this too challenging please choose phase 2, 3 or 4 instead. The website is:

Maths Tasks:

Task 1

Have your child go on a 2D shape hunt around the house and find as many squares, rectangles, triangles and circles as they as they can. Have them record their findings into their book. Your child can also watch the

• Task 2

Have your child go on a 3D shape hunt around the house and find as many spheres, cylinders, cubes, cuboids, cones and pyramids as they as they can. Have them record their findings into their book. Task 3

Have your child compare the weight of 2 different objects. The objects need to be small enough to fit in their hands so that they can feel how heavy/light each object is. Then, have them write a sentence about the objects in their book using the words 'heavier' or 'lighter' (e.g.: The plate is heavier than the pillow; The toy car is lighter than the candle). Repeat this activity with 10 different pairs of small objects for a total of 10 sentences in their books.


Task 4

Building on Task 3, have your child order 3 small objects of their choosing from 'heaviest' to 'lightest'. Have them physically line up the

objects and then draw and label them into their books. Have your child then write 'heaviest' under the heaviest object and 'lightest' under the lightest object. Repeat this activity with 8 different sets of small objects for a total of 8 sentences in their books.

Task 5

Have your child write 10 sentences about the animals and objects in this picture using positional language. The



positional language is as follows: on top of, in front of, behind, below, under, over, next to, beside, to the left of, to the right of, inside, outside, in between.

Each day please also complete one of the following online activities:

- Use the Topmarks Daily 10 website. For Year 1 appropriate activities,
 Choose 'Level 1' from the dropdown menu. From there, your child can
 complete either an addition, subtraction or ordering activity. Please do
 a variety throughout the week. The website is:

- Use the Mathletics website to complete the weekly tasks that have been assigned to your child. Please also have your child use the site to practice some other concepts that they are familiar with. Other Tasks

RE:

Go through the Easter Story with your child. Then, have your child draw
a picture depicting what happened on each of these days: Palm Sunday,
Maundy Thursday (The Last Supper), Good Friday and Easter Sunday.
Have your child write some sentences to accompany each picture and
explain what happened on each day.

History:

- Have your child retell the main events of The Great Fire of London. Have them write at least one sentence about each of the following:
 - How the fire started.
 - Why the fire spread so easily.
 - What people did to try and stop the fire.
 - Which important building burned down.
 - How the fire stopped.

Science:

Have your child draw a picture of a plant in their book. Their picture needs to include: the flower, the stem, the leaves and the roots. Have your child label each part of the plant. Art/D.T.:

Have your child create a 3D cityscape using objects from around your house. Potential objects could be: tissue boxes, cereal boxes, water bottles, milk jugs, shoe boxes, etc. Have your child try and think about the different buildings that need to be in a city (schools, hospitals, churches, offices, houses, shops, etc.) and to make sure to include these in their model.

PSHE:

 Have your child make a poster explaining the correct way to wash their hands. Use the picture provided to help ensure that they remember all of the steps. Hang the poster in your house somewhere to remind everyone!
