School Trips

School trips are an important part of our school curriculum. They provide rich learning experiences that children remember forever. The contributions by parents towards the cost of a school trip are always paid on a voluntary basis. As a school we have been subsidising the costs of the school trips for a number of years now so that all children have the opportunity to attend educational visits. However, we have found that with our parents' contributions falling the school cannot afford to continue to pay the increased shortfall on trips. Therefore, moving forwards, **should we not get enough voluntary contributions to cover the cost of the school trips, they will unfortunately have to be cancelled**. In particular, if more children in Year 5 do not sign up for the Year 6 activity holiday before Wednesday when we have to pay the deposit, then the holiday will have to be cancelled. This is very disappointing as the children always love it.

<u>Earrings</u>

Please be aware that hooped earrings are **not** to be worn in school for safety reasons. A small stud can be worn in each ear. Earrings should not be worn for P.E. Children will be asked to remove them. If they are unable to do this they will not be allowed to take part in the P.E. lesson. Please teach your child how to take them out by themselves or alternatively leave them out on P.E. days if they are too young.

School Uniform

School Meals Price Increase



After careful consideration and due to the rising food costs, we will need to increase our meal price to £2.50 after the Easter holidays. We have always tried to keep our meal prices affordable to our families, however the current meal price is no longer covering these rising costs.

To ensure we can continue to fund a high-quality service that delivers healthy, nutritious meals, caters for all allergens and dietary requirements, and is served in a safe environment on our school premises, we will be increasing our meal price to £2.50 per day, £12.50 per week, from Monday 15th April.

Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will still receive free school meals under the Universal Infant Free School Meal scheme.

You may be entitled to apply for free school meals for your children if you receive one of the following income-related benefits:

Income Support

Income-based Job Seekers' Allowance

Income-related Employment and Support Allowance

Child Tax Credit combined with both a household income below £16,190 per annum and not in receipt of any Working Tax Credit

Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

Guarantee Element of state Pension Credit

Universal Credit, with annual household earnings of less than £7,400
