#### **Ventilation and extra clothes**

The government reinforced the message about the importance of ventilation in school buildings again saying that windows/doors should be open. Obviously as the temperature becomes colder outside this will mean classrooms will become colder too, despite the heating being on. To make this as comfortable as possible for children, they will need to wear extra layers. The following are examples of what they could wear:

- A school hoodie worn over the top of their normal school uniform including their jumper.
- Layers underneath their school uniform, for example, leggings worn underneath trousers, long sleeved vest/tops underneath their school shirt and jumper
- Fleece/ thick jumper ideally in grey, black, navy or purple worn over the top of their normal school uniform including their jumper but if you have something suitable in a different colour please do not buy one in the suggested colours.

Children will also need a thick warm winter coat to wear outside. Ideally this would not be worn in the classroom for lessons as it could be damp. It can also be difficult to write in a thick coat. Sturdy black school shoes are also needed to keep their feet warm and dry.
