Dates for Diaries... Next term is always a very busy one, we will send out dates for diaries as soon as we can, sports day etc will depend on how well the field recovers from all of the heavy machinery that has driven across it over the past 6 months! - Monday 10th June until Friday 21st June is phonics screening week. All Year 1 and 2 children need to be in school every day during these dates.
