





#### Eid for Nylah by Nizrana Farook

As part of our World Book Day celebrations, every child was given one of these World Book Day books to take home.


















Thank you to everyone who came to the Scholastic Book Fair! It was a huge success and we have been able to purchase some new books for the library.





#### Ice Apprentices by Jacob North
