This half term we meet author Abi Elphinstone the author of books including The Dream Snatcher series, The Snow Dragon, Sky Song and The Unmapped Chronicles.


I love Abi's books and I am sure you will too!

We Are All Under One Sky by Deborah Wiles Aimed at 3+






Leighton recommends!
