
wow! what a half term of reading we have had!

This half term, we meet the Reading Squad – we have so much to tell you.



<u>We're Going to Find a Monster by Malorie Blackman and Dapo</u> <u>Adeola</u>


Aimed at 3+



## <u>Events</u>




In October, the children in years 5 and 6 took part in a live author event with Joseph Coelho to celebrate Black History Month.


Joseph is a poet who has written several books including Happy Here (a copy was donated to the school by The Book Trust).
