CORE SUBJECTS

ENGLISH

Text focus: The Everywhere Bear, The Teddy Robber, Paddington and the Christmas Surprise. Robin Robin

Writing focus:

- Sentences about where the Everywhere Bear visited and a missing bear poster
- 2. Sentences explaining why the Teddy Robber takes teddies and a letter saying sorry
- 3. Sentences for a Christmas list, a letter to Father Christmas and sentenced to retell the Paddington story.
- 4. Sentences to describe Robin's feelings and a narrative recount of part of the story.

Reading: guided reading for year 2, story time and class read each day

Spelling, grammar and punctuation: a range of grammar and punctuation embedded daily. High Frequency word spellings sent home each week to practice (children will not be tested)

Phonics: taught daily in groups with sounds appropriate to each child's phonic knowledge and challenge point
