

Lower Key Stage 2

<u>ENGLISH</u>

Text focus: Book of Greek Myths, Falling out of the Sky (poems about myths and monsters), a range of non-fiction texts about Ancient Greece, The Lumberjack's Beard (whole school writing project)

Writing focus:

1. Retelling of the Greek Myth Theseus and the Minotaur. 2. An atmospheric setting description of the maze from Theseus and the Minotaur. 3. A speech in role as a character from the Lumberjack's Beard. 4. Rules for living in my beard from the Lumberjack's Beard. 5. Action and dialogue writing from a Greek Myth. 6. Poetry writing using Falling out of the Sky. 7. Information text about the Ancient Greeks.

Reading: guided reading 30 minutes per day, class read 10 minutes per day, independent reading 20 minutes per day.

Spelling, grammar and punctuation: a range of grammar and punctuation embedded daily, spelling taught in class 3 times per week. Spellings will be sent home on a Friday to be tested on the following Friday.

Daily phonics and spelling taught targeting those children who need to still
