Our children and families are still recovering from this difficult time. All covid restrictions for schools were only removed in March 2022...time seems to have played a great many tricks over the last few years.

There are going to be a number of changes in September, some due to staffing changes and some because, as a staff we are always reflecting and considering what works well, what needs to change and what needs to be stopped.

Since the pandemic we have noticed there is a reduction in resilience of our children, and recognised the difficulties they face with social interactions, particularly at break and lunchtimes. There have been a number of efforts made to improve their experience, with this in mind we have sourced Opal play to work with staff, parents, governors and children to establish play skills that will support them in life, the project builds on many of the skills developed in Forest Schools. Mrs Cassidy will be further supporting this project by updating our Behaviour Policy to encourage our children to make the appropriate choices that meet our Catholic ethos.

Attendance and Lateness

I am sure you are aware that the government are very keen to improve attendance Nationally, this work is being supported by Rochdale LA, consequently we have regular visits from the Education Welfare Officer (EWO). She is particularly looking at lateness and holidays during term time.

The gates are opened at 8:30am and the first bell goes at 8:40am, there are early morning activities to be completed up to the next bell at 8:50am. Once the gates are closed, children are to be signed in on the Inventry system at the Main Entrance. This information is fed into the registers and the LA pull this as data for the visits from the EWO.

I realise that some children struggle in a morning and we have systems and support for them in school, if your child is struggling please let us know so we can support you and them.
