Measuring the impact of PPG spending

Pupil Outcomes Summer 2018

End of Foundation Stage:

75.6% of pupils achieved a Good Level of Development (GLD) in 2018 compared to 75% of pupils in 2017

Phonics Screen Check

In the Year 1 Phonics Screening Check, **65%** of children achieved the required standard compared to 72.7% of children in 2017

Key Stage 1:

87% of pupils achieved age related expectations (ARE) in Reading and **31%** achieved above ARE in end of KS1 SATs (based on Teacher Assessment) compared with 95.7% ARE and 28.3% above ARE in 2017

64% of pupils achieved age related expectations (ARE) in Writing and **13%** achieved above ARE in end of KS1 SATs (based on Teacher Assessment) compared with 84.8% ARE and 19.6% above ARE in 2017

80% of pupils achieved age related expectations (ARE) in Maths and **18%** achieved above ARE in end of KS1 SATs (based on Teacher Assessment) compared with 87.0% ARE and 19.6% above ARE in 2017

58% of children achieved KS1 Reading, Writing & Maths combined in 2018 compared to 82.6% in 2017

Key Stage 2:

80% of children achieved age related expectations (ARE) in Maths in the end of KS2 SATs, **27%** achieving the higher standard compared with 70.4% ARE and 13.6% ARE in 2017.

Progress score in Maths – 2.38

44% of disadvantaged children achieved age related expectations (ARE) in Maths in the end of KS2 SATs, **0%** achieving the higher standard

Disadvantaged progress score in Maths - 1.65

73% of children achieved age related expectations (ARE) in Writing in the end of KS2 SATs, with **11%** achieving the higher standard (based on Teacher Assessment) compared with 70.4%) ARE and 20.5% ARE in 2017

Progress score in Writing - 1.24

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56% of disadvantaged children achieved age related expectations (ARE) in Writing in the end of KS2 SATs, with **0%** achieving the higher standard (based on Teacher Assessment)

Disadvantaged progress score in Writing - 2.90

80% of children achieved age related expectations (ARE) in Reading in the end of KS2 SATs, with **36%** achieving the higher standard compared with 72.7% ARE and 29.5% ARE in 2017

Progress score in Reading - 3.78

67% of disadvantaged children achieved age related expectations (ARE) in Reading in the end of KS2 SATs, with **11%** achieving the higher standard

Disadvantaged progress score in Reading - 3.58

75% of children achieved age related expectations (ARE) in Grammar, Punctuation & Spelling in the end of KS2 SATs, **32%** achieving the higher standard compared to 86.3% achieving ARE and 27.3% achieving the higher standard in 2017

56% of disadvantaged children achieved age related expectations (ARE) in Grammar, Punctuation & Spelling in the end of KS2 SATs, **11%** achieving the higher standard

66% of children achieved Reading, Writing & Maths (ARE) combined with **5%** achieving higher standard combined compared with 54.5%) in 2017

33% of disadvantaged children achieved Reading, Writing & Maths (ARE) combined with **0**% achieving higher standard combined.
