- As previous years, all other subject areas are taught on a two-year rolling programme.






CLIC/BIG MATHS



- CLIC is how the children will learn facts and engage with maths concepts and skills on a daily basis
- This is taught for 10 to 20 minutes each day in addition to their maths lesson

Times Tables



- Practised at school everyday-focus on one each week.
- To practise at home on a daily basis. There will be a times table test each week.
- Many maths topics taught in school require this knowledge and will help when applying to the maths curriculum.

Spellings



- Focus on key spelling patterns each week- Daily spelling programme taught 15 minutes each day. (Covers the year 5 and 6 spellings)
- Practise at home and regularly-recorded in School Planner.
- Also, practise the expected spelling for year 5 and 6 (list available to take away)
- Children will be tested each week and scores recorded in their School Planner.

School Planner

- To use as a daily record for reading-date and sign.
- Spellings for the week recorded.
- Message/comment-communicate between home/school.
- Sign/date at the end of each week.





Science Ambassadors

The role of a Science Ambassador is to:

- Plan activities for Science Week and various scientific events

In addition to the above, there will also be opportunities to work with other schools and lead events where parents and members of the parish will be invited to attend. With this in mind, it is crucial that behaviour of the Science Ambassadors is of a high standard and any incidents of poor behaviour will result in the role being withdrawn.

French Ambassadors

- Very similar responsibilities to the science ambassadors. Giving the older children in our school the opportunity to not only raise the profile of the subject but again, take on that extra responsibility of being a Year 5/6 child.
- <u>Responsibilities include:</u>
- Helping to run events like 'European Day of Languages.'
- Working closely with the Modern Languages coordinator and to help teach French to younger years to solidify learning.
- Plan and manage our 'French Day' which will be coming up in November.
- Help to run assemblies on the back of our 'Erasmus' project which has been funded for St. Thomas More by 'Erasmus' under the British Council. This has been awarded in order to upskill staff and ensure the highest quality of teaching in a foreign language.

Behaviour


- Expect extremely high standards at all times.
