The eggs will stay inside our classroom and the children will have the opportunity to observe the chicks hatch and see them grow and change over two weeks. We will be discussing Spring and will continue to look closely at the natural world and seasonal changes in our environment and discuss them. We will also be continuing to develop our Technology skills and using

We will be discussing the importance of healthy eating and exercise in relation to the growth and change aspects of our topic.
