Writing focus:

1. Dialogue using inverted commas between Oliver and Mr Bumble. 2. Instructions on how to be in Fagin's gang. 3. Character description from The Selfish Giant. 4. Dialogue using inverted commas between the Giant and the child.

Reading: guided reading 30 minutes per day, class read 10 minutes per day, independent reading 20 minutes per day.

Spelling, grammar and punctuation: a range of grammar and punctuation embedded daily, spelling taught in class 3 times per week. Spellings will be sent home on a Friday to be tested on the following Friday.
