

# Lower Key Stage 2

#### **ENGLISH**

**Text focus:** A Beowulf Tale: Monster Slayer by Brian Pattern, The Complete Book of Dragons by Cressida Cowell, Dare to Care: Pet Dragon.

#### Writing focus:

1. A scary character description of Grendel, 2. An atmospheric setting description of Grendel's swamp, 3. Dialogue to convey characters, 4. Kenning poems for Beowulf's sword, 5 & 6. Non-chronological report on dragons.

**Reading:** guided reading 30 minutes per day, class read 10 minutes per day, independent reading 20 minutes per day.

**Spelling, grammar and punctuation:** a range of grammar and punctuation embedded daily, spelling taught in class 3 times per week. Spellings will be sent home on a Friday to be tested on the following Friday.

Daily phonics and spelling taught targeting those children who need to still access phonics teaching

# RHE—Keeping Safe

Children will learn:

To recognise that their increasing independence brings increased responsibility to keep themselves and others safe • How to use technology safely • That just as what we eat can make us healthy or make us ill, so what we watch, hear, say or do can be good or bad for us and others • How to report and get help if they encounter inappropriate materials or messages how to respond

How to use technology safely • That bad language and bad behaviour are inappropriate • That just as what we eat can make us healthy or make us ill, so what we watch, hear, say or do can be good or bad for us and others • How to report and get help if they encounter inappropriate materials or messages

To judge well what kind of physical contact is acceptable or unacceptable and how to respond • That there are different people we can trust for help, especially those who care for us, including our teachers and parish priest

Understand the effect that a range of substances including drugs, tobacco and alcohol can have on the body. • Know that our bodies are created by God, so we should take care of them and be careful about what we consume.

In an emergency, it is important to remain calm. • Quick reactions in an emergency can save a life. • Children can help in an emergency using their First Aid knowledge.
