Text focus: Brother Eagle, Sister Sky, Stuart Little by EB White, a range of non-fiction books of America, How to tight rope walk

Writing focus:

1. A persuasive/emotive speech from Chief Seattle, 2. A persuasive brochure about America, 3. A narrative of Stuart Little travelling through New York, 4. Instructions on how to tight rope walk between towers

Reading: guided reading 30 minutes per day, class read 10 minutes per day, independent reading 20 minutes per day.

Spelling, grammar and punctuation: a range of grammar and punctuation embedded daily, spelling taught in class 3 times per week. Spellings will be sent home on a Friday to be tested on the following Friday.
