## SUGGESTIONS FOR HOME ACTIVITIES

As a family talk about how you are going to practice self-control and self-giving for the rest of the season of Lent. You may decide to give up biscuits or cakes and donate the money to a charity.

If you have an older child provide him/her with an opportunity to take part in The Stations of the Cross.

Ask your children how the school is focusing on Lent and self-giving.

# Supporting your children in PE

As part of your children's most recent school reports, you will have noticed that we have begun to include a target for your child in RE.

As a catholic school RE is one of our core subjects, and by reporting on your children's targets in RE three times a year we hope it will enable you to further support your children's learning and progress at home.

Attending mass regularly is of great benefit to your children, and explaining the significance of the symbols and practises seen at mass will enable your children to understand the reasons why we do what we do as Christians and Catholics.

Below is a brief overview of some of the skills that we are developing in each of our phases during their RE lessons.

#### **EYFS**

To recognise key religious symbols (the sign of the cross etc.)

To join in with prayer and hymn singing.

To recognise the Bible as a special book.

To listen to and talk about religious stories.

#### KS1

To recognise key religious symbols and consider why they are important.  $\label{eq:consider}$ 

To be able to recognise and retell religious stories.

To recognise the signs and symbols used in worship (sign of peace, sign of the cross, lighting of the candle).

#### KS2

To show knowledge and understanding of a range of religious stories and scripture.

To consider what we can learn from scripture.

To make links between what they read in the Bible and how they can act this out in their lives.
