

Trip and Payment Reminder – Brentwood Cathedral

A reminder of the Year 3 trip to Brentwood Cathedral on Wednesday 19th March.

Due to coach and travel timings, we will need the children to arrive at school slightly earlier than usual. Please ensure that your child has arrived at school by 8:10am, as we will be leaving promptly at 8:25am. The coach will not be able to wait for latecomers.

The cost of this trip is £5.05 per child. **Payments should now have been made on SchoolGateway.** By paying for the school trip, you are providing your consent for your child to participate. If payment has not been received, then we will take this as you not consenting for your child to participate. **If your child qualifies for pupil premium please ensure that you have emailed office@stursulasprimaryschool.co.uk providing your permission.**

Times Table Rockstars:

They should also be regularly using the **Soundcheck** game on TTRS to practise their times tables under timed conditions.

A NOTE ABOUT SNACKS
