The success of these sessions has paved he way for both a Key Stage 1 and KS2 Magical Maths club, starting after the Easter break.

Our School Explorer Ambassadors took this mission to heart, spearheading a competition to encourage sustainable travel and promoting cycling and scooting as eco-friendly alternatives for the school commute.
