One particular line stuck with me: "In God's hands, nothing and no one is ever lost. Separated from us for a time, yes, but not lost."

SUPPORTING PUPILS WITH LEARNING SPANISH AT HOME

Pupils from Year 3 to 6 are taught Spanish for 1 hour per week. If you want to further support this learning we recommend using a free app called **Duolingo** which is available for download on mobile devices and can be used on tablets and computers. The app offers bite-sized Spanish lessons and activities with tips about grammar, vocabulary, and pronunciation. There are also lots of other fun ways to support your child's Spanish skills such as:

- ♦ Creating a playlist of Spanish songs. Children can write down the words they recognise from their favourite songs. There are many famous singers who release their songs in Spanish.
- ♦ Watch a movie in Spanish. For support use English subtitles but if your child wants a challenge then choose Spanish subtitles.

Every class has a worry monster where children can write down or draw their worries and post it into the mouth of the colourful creature. Teachers will check the worry monster each day and will speak to individual children about their worries or if there is a common theme there

may be a class discussion. Children often find it easier to initially share their concern with an inanimate object, then as trusted adults, staff will choose the right time to bring up the worry and talk about it in a reassuring way. We hope that our new additions will encourage our children to share what is on their mind.
