I am the Computing and Online Safety Lead for St Ursula's. It is important that the school and parents work together to teach our pupils about the safe use of the internet. At the start of each year, the first 6 weeks of ICT lessons are dedicated to online safety and annually we celebrate Safer Internet Week. Each summer term we invite PC Wayne to talk to children about the consequences of online bullying and not being safe online. All of our pupils have signed an Acceptable Use Agreement that outlines the school's expectation of pupil behaviour while online.

We also hope this will be a starting point for you to talk to your children about the need to keep safe online and that they will feel they can tell you about anything that worries them.
