Last Sunday was the first Sunday of Advent. Advent is a special time of the year for our community and it is important that we continue celebrate as we have always done.

Each Monday, the Gospel reading from Sunday Mass is shared with our children, during a virtual **Gospel assembly**. Children have explored the Advent wreath and two lucky children were chosen to light the Advent Wreaths in EYFS/KS1 & KS2.

To help us remember the Christmas Story we have invited each family to join our special project called "The Virtual Travelling Nativity".

As many of our families will know, when we reach December, Father Christmas drops a delivery of **reindeer food** into school. We ask for a small donation from the children to help Rudolph and his friends enjoy a special Christmas!
