TEACHER STRIKES

You will be aware that the NEU have called their members to participate in strikes, to be held on:

NSPCC - SPEAK OUT. STAY SAFE

Next week we will be participating in the NSPCC's *Speak out. Stay safe.* online programme. This consists of an online assembly and supporting classroom based activities. Speak out. Stay safe. is a safeguarding programme that aims to help children understand



abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse in a child friendly way. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a trusted adult or via Childline.

In the online assembly, the *Speak out. Stay safe*. messages are delivered in a fun and interactive way with the help of their mascot, Buddy, as well as special guest appearances from Ant and Dec.

The programme links directly to the curriculum, focusing on relationships. We have studied the content of the materials and are extremely confident that they are appropriate for primary -school-aged children. PUPIL PREMIUM FUNDING-YOU MAY BE ELIGIBLE

With the sudden and challenging rise in the cost of living, we want to make sure that our parents and carers are aware of the funding that may be available for their children at St Ursula's Catholic Primary School. The School receives an extra \pm 1,345 for every eligible pupil who is registered for Pupil Premium funding.

This extra money could make a real difference to the quality of education we offer and will also support families financially as in-school costs will be subsidised. For example, if your Pupil Premium application is successful, your child will receive a £100 School Uniform Voucher; fully Ffnded School trips and children will continue to receive free school meals up to Year 6. Based on the current cost of school trips and school dinners you could be saving £473 on average per year, per pupil.

If your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 and already receives free school meals, you should still register because we'll receive the extra pupil premium funding. You can apply for Pupil Premium funding at <u>ANY</u> time. Parents of children from Reception to Year 6 can apply.

A simple check can be quickly completed at school to see if your child is eligible. Come and speak with Mrs. Walsh and she will make an online application. The only information you will need to provide is your National Insurance Number and date of birth.

POKEMON CLUB

As part of our pupil voice, our pupils completed a Pupil Survey where they shared their thoughts and ideas about the school. A common theme was that although we have a variety of clubs, many of these are sport related and our pupils would like to see other activities, that reflect their interests and hobbies. One of the suggestions was a Pokémon Club.

I'm pleased to announce that Mr Groome (Year 5 Teacher) will be running a weekly Key Stage 2 Pokémon Club. The aim of the club is to teach children the ins and outs of competitive card games, such as deck -building, strategy, probability and resource-management. They will be looking at the way that different decks function and how participants can improve their own decks.

The club will take place each Thursday from 3:15pm to 4:30pm. A letter has been sent home with pupils who declared an interest and have been chosen.
