Great Fire Of London Theatre Workshop

We are pleased to inform you that we have arranged a Year 2 visit from Trunk Theatre on Tuesday 18th November 2025. This visit links to our Autumn 2 CLC topic – The Great Fire of London and will be an excellent opportunity for the children to immerse themselves in the story of what happened.

The educational objectives for the visit are:

- 1. Learn the story of the fire of London.
- 2. Understand how we know about the fire of London.
- 3. Find out what happened after the fire.

The timings for the day are as follows: The Theatre troupe will arrive in school hours. The visit will take place in the afternoon in the school hall and finish well before home time.

The cost of this visit will be £9.62 per child. Payments should be made via SchoolComms by Friday 14th November 2025. By paying for the school visit you will be providing your consent for your child to participate. Weekly Spelling Homework and Test

A reminder that the Spelling Shed homework is used to revise the weekly spelling list – this is in preparation for the weekly spelling test that takes place on Fridays. Children should be **completing at least 3 games per week** to revise the weekly spelling list.

Reading Comprehension at home

When your child is completing their daily reading, it is important that you are also discussing the text with them in order to develop their reading comprehension skills. While fluency in reading is important, in Key Stage 2 there is a much larger focus on inference skills, summarizing and sequencing skills, understanding vocabulary, understanding the author's choices and using evidence from the text to support ideas. Below are some example questions to support your discussions during your child's daily reading time...

What does this word/phrase/sentence tell you about the character/setting/ mood? By writing..., what effect has the author created? Do you think they intended to? What other words/phrases could the author have used here? Why? How has the author made you feel by writing ...? Why? Find the ... in this text. Is it anywhere else? When/where is this story set? How do Find the part of the story that best describes the setting. What do you think is happening here? Why? What might this mean?

Summarising Questions What is the main point in this paragraph? Is it mentioned anywhere else? Sum up what has happened so far in X words/seconds or less. Which is the most important point in these paragraphs? Why? Do any sections/paragraphs deal with the same themes? Be an Author What does the word... tell you about...? How? Find two ways that the author tells What do you think the author meant by...?

Inference Questions What do you think..... means? Why do you think that? Could it be anything else? I think...; do you agree? Why / why How do you think...? Can you explain why ...? What do these words mean and why do you think that the author chose them? **Prediction Questions** Can you think of another story with a similar theme? How do their plots differ? Which stories have openings like this? Do you think that this story will develop the same way? Why did the author choose this setting? Will that influence the story? Compare, Contrast and Comment What is similar/different about two characters? Did the author intend that? Explain why... did that.

Describe different characters' reactions to the same event.

- Is this as good as ...? Which is better and why?
- Which words do you think are most important? Why?
- Which words do you like the most? Why?
 - How has the author made you feel happy / sad / angry / frustrated?
