## Reading homework

We expect our pupils to read for 15-20 minutes per day to support their learning at school. Through reading and hearing stories, children are exposed to a wide range of words. This helps them build their own vocabulary and improve their understanding when they read, which is vital as they continue to develop their

narrative writing. We expect reading journals to be filled out with the book title and pages read before being signed by a parent or carer and brought into school on a daily basis and we'll be monitoring this regularly.

## **Subject Information**

**RE:** In R.E., our first topic is Creation and Covenant. In Year 6 we will be looking at the second account of Creation. We will be trying to develop an understanding of what is meant by the 'Fall' and the significance of the sacrament of Baptism as a forgiveness of sin.



**English:** Our first text in Year 6 is 'Kensuke's Kingdom' by Michael Morpurgo and a favourite for many Year 6 children. Children will write poems, letters, newspaper articles and many other forms of writing based on the events in the story. We then move on to study 'The Silver Sword', which is a story that follows the lives of a Polish family seeking refuge during World War II. Please see the short blurb below.

### Kensuke's Kingdom

When Michael is washed up on an island in the Pacific after falling from his parent's yacht, the Peggy Sue, he struggles to survive on his own. But he soon realises there is someone close by, someone who is watching over him and helping him to stay alive. Following a close-run battle between life and death after being stung by a poisonous jelly fish, the mysterious someone--Kensuke--allows Michael into his world and they become friends, teaching and learning from each other, until the day of separation becomes inevitable.

Morpurgo here spins a yarn which gently captures the adventurous elements one would expect from a desert-island tale, but the real strength lies in the poignant and subtle observations of friendship, trust and, ultimately, humanity.

#### The Silver Sword

In the chaos of World War II, Ruth, Edek and Bronia are separated from their parents, and left alone to fend for themselves, hiding from the Nazis in the ruins of their city, Warsaw. But when they meet orphan Jan, who treasures a paperknife in the shape of a silver sword that he was given by an escaped prisoner of war, it becomes a powerful symbol of hope. The children realise that the escapee was their father, and the silver sword is a message that he is alive and searching for them. Together with Jan theu begin a dangerous journey across Europe to the safety of Switzerland where they hope to reunite with their parents. It is the story of a terrible time made bearable by the strong streak of humanity at its heart and by the unusual acts of kindness the children experience on their travels.

**Science:** In science, we will be looking at Animals (Including humans) with a particular focus on the impact exercise and diet has on the body's ability to function. After half term, the children will then be moving onto 'Evolution and Inheritance'.

**CLC:** Our first CLC topic in Year 6 is 'Where shall we sail to?' During this topic, children will be learning how to read maps, study different countries and cultures and using what they have learnt to prepare our International Day, which will be held on Friday 25<sup>th</sup> October. After half term, the children will then be discovering what life was like in England during the Blitz.
