After we have completed our SATs we will no longer be using the CGP books, however we will continue to complete our online, CLC and Religious Education homework.

Your CGP Maths book will be sent home weekly. Pages to be completed will be directed in your homework diaries. (Please only complete the directed pages)

Grammar homework: Your CGP Grammar book will be sent home weekly. Pages to be completed will be directed in your homework diaries. (Please only complete the directed pages)

Reading homework - We expect our pupils to read for 15-20 minutes per day to support their learning at school. We expect reading journals to be signed and brought into school on a daily basis and we'll be monitoring this regularly. Remember there will be prizes for those children who have read the most!

Flipped Curriculum – Each half term children are sent home with a flipped curriculum map, these maps include creative and investigative tasks that allow children to explore the topics we are learning about in greater detail. Children are expected to completed at least 2 tasks each half term.

## Subject Information





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RE: In R.E this term we will be focusing on the following topics: Pentecost - 'Witnesses', Reconciliation - 'Healing' and Universal Church - 'Common good'. In Year 6 we focus more on making links between faith and scripture and we encourage you to discuss this at home. For one week during this term we will be focusing on Islamic festivals.

English: The Summer term will start off with a non-fiction text focusing on the History of Art, the children will be exploring the various periods and reflecting on the impact these artistic changes had on the world at the time, as well as our society today. In the second part of the Summer term we will be reading Romeo and Juliet, exploring one of Shakespeare's most iconic and famous plays and the discussions it provokes.

Science: In the first half of this term the children will be studying 'Living Things: Classification'. They will examine and analyse different living things - from animals to micro-organisms - using the Linnaean System. After half term, the children will be analysing the mechanics of human movement in the context of sport and creating plans to improve performances.

CLC: Our first topic in CLC will be focused on the question 'What is Art?' During this topic, children will explore the evolution of art from the ancient civilisations to modern day. After half-term the Year 6 production will take centre stage as the children rehearse their lines and songs for the Year 6 play.



PE: PE lessons will be on Wednesdays and Thursdays. Please ensure that your child comes into school on their PE days wearing the correct PE kit. We encourage children to come to school with a refillable water bottle to keep hydrated throughout the day.
