Acceptable Use Policy Agreement

- I know I need permission to take someone's photograph or video them.
- I will be polite and responsible when I communicate with others when sending messages on the MLE.
- I will inform an adult if I see or receive any unpleasant material or messages.
- I will be aware of "stranger danger", when I am communicating on-line.
- I will not disclose or share personal information about myself or others when online.
- I will respect others' work.
- I will report any damage or faults involving equipment or software to my teacher.
- When I am using the internet to find information, I should take care to check that the information that I access is accurate.
