Key Reminders

- Pupils should wear blazers while moving around the school building unless otherwise advised by staff. They may be removed during break and lunchtime when outside and in classrooms once given permission by staff.

Next week, we will continue to carry out uniform checks each day. Thank you for your support in ensuring all pupils arrive with correct uniform.
