

- Plan your route.
 - Check the arrival and destination times.
 - Leave plenty of time to get to the bus stop calmly and safely.
 - Don't stand too close to the edge of the curb when waiting for your bus.
 - Check the bus number.

- Once on the bus you should remain seated until the bus has stopped.
 - Use the handrail.
 - Exit the bus calmly and thank your driver.
 - Remember the green cross code and think about the danger zones while the bus is stopped.



- Cooperate with transport staff and treat them and other passengers with respect.
- Be obviously kind in your words and actions.
- Ensure you are the only person that can hear your music.

- Ring the bell once, when you want to leave.
- Don't distract your driver.
- Respect the bus, leaving the seat the way you would hope to find it.





POP CARDS

You can travel at concessionary child fares all day, every day on all public transport in Tyne and Wear if you have an Under 16 Pop card.

The current fares with an Under 16 Pop card are:
Single - 60p
Child All-day Ticket - £1.10

How to use your Under 16 Pop card:

- On the Metro you must touch your Under 16 Pop card onto the orange reader on the Metro ticket machine to buy concessionary tickets.
- On buses, show the driver your pass when you buy your ticket.



WALKING OR CYCLING TO SCHOOL

For those of you who wish to walk or cycle to school we have a number of entrances to suit your route. The Local Authority provides school crossing patrol officers on a number of the roads around the school.

If you're cycling to school you should ensure you dismount your bike when entering the school property. At St Wilfrid's we have a bike store to securely stow your bike until the end of the school day. All pupils are expected to walk with their bikes to the bike store, this reduces pupil's risk to injury.
