What families can do:

- Talk to your child about VPNs and safe internet use.
- Check their devices for VPN apps (look in Settings > VPN).
- Use parental controls like Google Family Link or Apple Screen Time.
- Set clear rules about app downloads and online activity.

We're excited to share our extra-curricular timetable for this term, offering a wide range of clubs and activities to support your child's personal growth and interests outside the classroom.

From sports and music to academic support and wellbeing, there's something for everyone:

- Sports Clubs Pupils can take part in lunchtime and after-school sports that link directly to their PE lessons, helping them build confidence and skills.
- Music Opportunities Choir, orchestra, and band rehearsals are open to all. One-to-one instrumental lessons are also available—please speak to Mrs Tolan if your child is interested.
- Academic Support A lunchtime study space is available for Key Stage 4 pupils, and our Homework Club runs Tuesday to Friday after school in the library for all year groups.

- Youth SVP Group Led by our chaplain, this group helps pupils grow in leadership, service, and reflection.


Over the coming weeks, we'll be highlighting some of these clubs in more detail so you can see the fantastic experiences your children are enjoying.
