The timetable for this set of prelims is available on our school website, alongside ongoing information about revision sessions which are open to all pupils.

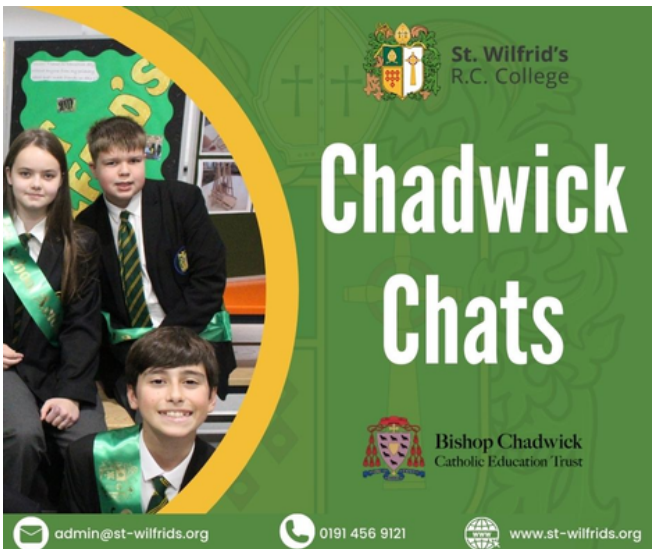
Prelim Timetable
