#### **Catholic Life**

October is the month of the Holy Rosary. By tradition, the Catholic Church dedicates each month of the year to a certain devotion. The month of October is dedicated to the holy Rosary as the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary falls on October 7th. The best way to celebrate the month is, of course, to pray the Rosary. We are grateful for the support provided to school by the Legion of Mary who visit school during October to lead the children in Rosary sessions.



One of our key focuses in school this year is Catholic Social Teaching. Catholic social teaching (CST) is rooted in Scripture, formed by the wisdom of Church leaders, and influenced by grassroots movements. It is our moral compass, guiding us on how to live out our faith in the world. There are seven Catholic Social principles and we will be focusing on a specific one of these principles each month with the children to help deepen their understanding of it and so that we can see these principles lived out in daily school life. In September we focused on 'Community and the Common Good' while in October we will move our focus to 'Rights and Responsibilities'. We are developing further information on this initiative to be sent home to parents in the near future.

Next weeks sessions will have a focus on English, Reading, Writing and phonics and we are planning a further session later in the year focusing on maths. All children will have the opportunity to bring their parents into the classroom to experience how they learn Literacy through activity based learning. We are hoping for a great turnout and we hope that parents will be able to learn a few new strategies that they can use at home.
