**Infant Children** have morning lessons from 8:55am to 12:00pm. Lunch is 12:00pm – 12:45pm and afternoon lessons start at 12:45pm and finish at 3:10pm.

**Junior Children** have morning lessons from 9am to 12:15pm, with lunch at 12:15pm – 1:15pm. Afternoon lessons commence at 1:15wpm and finish at 3:10pm.



## Wraparound care

#### **Breakfast Club:**

We offer a breakfast club to our parents from 8am to 8:55am each day. Children can have a healthy, nutritious breakfast while enjoying some social time with their friends.

There are a range of educational activities available for children attending breakfast club.

The cost of breakfast club is £3 per session.

#### **Afterschool Child Care:**

Teatime club is available each day for children from 3:15pm to 4:15pm. Teachers and Teaching Assistants lead teatime club and offer a range of activities such as cooking, art, dance, chess and computing. Teatime club is £2 per session.
