The children have settled well into school life and have been enjoying a range of practical activities both indoors and out.

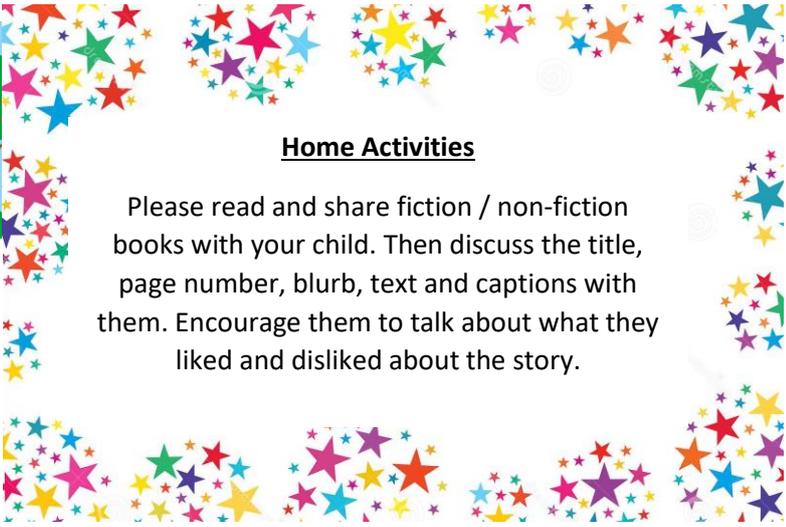

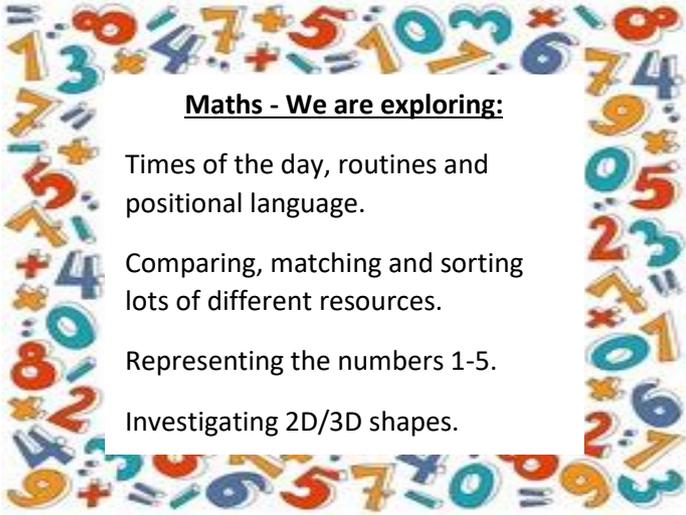
### Autumn Topics

This term we will be focusing on the topics - All about me, Autumn, Winter and people who help us in our community.



### Home Activities

Please read and share fiction / non-fiction books with your child. Then discuss the title, page number, blurb, text and captions with them. Encourage them to talk about what they liked and disliked about the story.



### Maths - We are exploring:

Times of the day, routines and positional language.

Comparing, matching and sorting lots of different resources.

Representing the numbers 1-5.

Investigating 2D/3D shapes.



### Phonics

Nursery are developing their listening and speaking skills. They are tuning into everyday sounds that are all around them.

Reception are learning to recognise sounds, write them and turn them into simple words.

### Notices
