Lent is nearly here

This week is a an incredibly busy and significant week for us in our continuing faith journey. We celebrate two special days, Mardi Gras on Tuesday and Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent the following day.

Mardi Gras is traditionally a day when people indulge in rich food as part of a celebration before Lent begins. Typically, people would use up their eggs, flour, milk and oil, before Lent.

Mardi Gras is the last day of the carnival season. It has other names too, such as; Fat Tuesday, Shrove Tuesday and Pancake Day! It is a happy day, people wear green, purple and gold and put on colourful masks. They participate in parades and celebrations, they might even eat some King Cake, a sweet and colourful cake.

Then on the following day, Lent begins...

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday. On this day many Christians attend mass and receive ashes on their foreheads. Lent is 40 days when we pray, fast and give as we prepare to celebrate Easter. In prayer, we put aside time to be with God and to let God love us. In fasting, we give up something we want, so that we can be open to what God wants. In almsgiving, we give generously to others, as God has been generous to us.

Laudato Si Centre Visit

Last week some of our children from the GIFT Team and the Laudato Si Eco Team visited the Laudato Si Centre in Wardley. They learned all about the Encyclical letter from Pope Francis to the world and learned about how we can further care for Our Common Home. The children came away with lots of ideas. If your child is not going to be able to come to school for any reason it is important that you let us know.

There are a number of ways to do this

- 1. Report your child's absence using the Parentsapps
- 2. Telephone school

We may require evidence of the reasons for your child being absent (such as an appointment card / letter from your doctor) but please speak to a member of staff about your child's absence and we can let you know if we require any further evidence.

Punctuality

Please ensure that children are on time for school. The gates close at 8.50am and all children are expected to be in class and registered by 8.55am. If your child is later than 8.50am they will receive a L (late) mark. If your child is later than 9.20am they will receive a U (unauthorised) mark.

Latecomers cause disruption for pupils and teachers, and learning time is lost. All latecomers are recorded in a 'Late register' in the main entrance. Children should be collected punctually by a responsible adult (over the age of 16) at the time their class finishes. When children are not collected on time, they will wait in after school club and you will be charged for the session.

Safeguarding & Health:

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Free School Meals:



Eligibility is based on one of the following benefits :

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
