

# **Religious Education:**

#### **Advent**

Advent marks the beginning of the Church's Year. Advent means arrival: preparing ourselves for God's arrival into the world.

In our schools we try to make the celebration of Advent the priority, helping those in our school community to understand that the real reason for our expectant joy leading up to Christmas is the hope and gift of Jesus Christ — the light of the world coming to transform us so that we can transform our families, our schools and our world.

The Advent wreath, the Jesse tree and the crib are just some of the symbols that can be used in our schools for reflection throughout the season. From Monday 27th November we will begin to send out our Travelling Nativity sets to families each day. The oldest sibling from each family will bring home a set so the family can share a prayer, story or discussion together, returning it to school the next day so that another family can have the opportunity to do the same.

This week as a school we will be joining in with the CAFOD national assembly on the morning of Tuesday 28th November to hear how children have been showing love in action this year, and to find out how we can be a light in the world this Advent too.

Pope Francis' prayer intention for December-

For persons with disabilities. We pray that people living with disabilities may be at the centre of attention in society, and that institutions may offer inclusive programs which value their active participation.

#### The Gospel Value for November is 'Patience' -

We have patience with one another and help each other to develop.

Lord, give me patience for today, so that I may overcome any difficult tasks ahead. Nothing is impossible with You by my side, and I pray that Your Holy Spirit showers me with grace and patience to see the end of the day with my head held high. I lift up everything to You Lord.

#### Mark 13: 33-37

33 Be careful! Always be ready![a] You don't know when that time will be. 34 It is like a man who goes on a trip. He leaves his house and lets his servants take care of it. He gives each servant a special job to do. One servant has the work of guarding the door. The man tells this servant always to be watchful. This is what I am now telling you. 35 You must always be ready. You don't know when the owner of the house will come back. He might come in the evening, or at midnight, or in the early morning, or when the sun rises. 36 He might come back quickly. If you are always ready, then he will not find you sleeping. 37 I tell you this, and I say this to everyone: 'Be ready!'"

If your child is not going to be able to come to school for any reason it is important that you let us know.

There are a number of ways to do this

- 1. Report your child's absence using the Parentsapps
- 2. Telephone school

We may require evidence of the reasons for your child being absent (such as an appointment card / letter from your doctor) but please speak to a member of staff about your child's absence and we can let you know if we require any further evidence.

#### **Punctuality**

Please ensure that children are on time for school. The gates close at 8.50am and all children are expected to be in class and registered by 8.55am. If your child is later than 8.50am they will receive a L (late) mark. If your child is later than 9.20am they will receive a U (unauthorised) mark.

Latecomers cause disruption for pupils and teachers, and learning time is lost. All latecomers are recorded in a 'Late register' in the main entrance. Children should be collected punctually by a responsible adult (over the age of 16) at the time their class finishes. When children are not collected on time, they will wait in after school club and you will be charged for the session.

## **Free School Meals:**



### Eligibility is based on one of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
