- Godparents help the person to be like God.


Words from Baptism

"I baptise you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."








What we want to remember.





Scripture

The night before he died, Jesus and his friends went to Jerusalem to celebrate a special meal together. While they were at table, Jesus took some bread, gave thanks to God, broke it and gave it out to his friends. He said, "Take and eat. This is my body, given for you. Do this in memory of me."

In the same way, Jesus took a cup of wine. He gave thanks, and gave it to them saying, "Take and drink. This is my blood shed for you."

Year 2: Topic 6 Lent/Easter: Giving - Opportunities

What should I already know?

- Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent.
- Jesus died on the cross on Good Friday.
- On Easter Sunday, we celebrate the day Jesus rose from the dead.



Big Question: How does each day offer opportunities for good?

What we want to remember.

- Every day we should try to do something good.
- On Ash Wednesday, a cross of ash is put on the forehead as a sign we are followers of Jesus.
- At the Last Supper, Jesus washed the feet of his disciples to remind us to serve each other.
- The Stations of the Cross tell the story of Good Friday

Year 2: Topic 8 Reconciliation – Rules


What should I already know?


- The Creation Story in Genesis
