Dear Parent / Guardian,

I know that some of you are concerned about the increase in cases of COVID-19 in the local area and that a few Trafford Schools have closed year groups as a result of a positive case. In school, we are doing all we can to keep the children safe and are following the guidance that has been given to us by Trafford, Public Health and the Department for Education. It is the responsibility of all of us to keep the children, and our whole family, safe and well. Can I remind you that the children should not be attending sleep-overs, parties or going for tea at a friend's house, as this breaks the current guidelines.

People who live in Trafford are still subject to extra lockdown measures. These mean **you should not:**

- Meet people you do not live with in other indoor public venues – such as pubs, restaurants, shops, places of worship. (You may attend these venues with people you live with (or are in a support bubble with*), but should avoid interaction with individuals or groups from other households).
- Meet people from other households in your home or garden. Household support bubbles are exempt.
- Visit someone else's home or garden, even if they live outside of the affected areas.
- Visit friends or family in care homes, other than in exceptional circumstances.
- Socialise with people you do not live with, unless they are in your support bubble, in any public venue. This applies to inside and outside of the affected areas. Examples of public venues include pubs, restaurants, cafes, shops, places of worship, community centres, leisure and entertainment venues or visitor attractions and parks.

***A support bubble is a close support network between a household with only one adult in the home (known as a single-adult household) and one other household of any size.**

This is called making a 'support bubble'. Once you're in a support bubble, you can think of yourself as being in a single household with people from the other household. It means you can have close contact with that household as if they were members of your own household. Once you make a support bubble, you should not change who is in your bubble.

Please stick to your allocated drop-off/pick up time. You must maintain social distancing whilst waiting for your child. If you are queuing for the ice cream man after school, please ensure you follow the social distancing rules.

Can you please make sure you inform the school office if your child is absent or if there is a change to who is collecting your child.
