Hi Reception here are some activities for you to enjoy at home

**Sharing activity** - make a pile of your toys, for example, cars, dolls, teddies, figures.

Next, decide to have 3 or 4 separate piles, you could find 1 cushion for each pile, to mark where your pile will be.

Then share out your chosen group, how many in each pile? can you share them out equally? Yes, if not why not? Try this activity with a different collection of toys.

**Sorting activity** - challenge yourself to find different ways of sorting objects or your toys. How many ways can you sort them, remember when you sort, you have to be able to say why they are in that group. Try to find an interesting way to sort them, it might be, for example, colour of buttons.

**Time** - ask an adult to write the days of the week on pieces of paper - practice putting the days of the week in order.

Write a sentence about something that you do on the different days of the week.

If you can, look at a clock that has a face, ask an adult to help you understand o'clock times. Challenge yourself to tell your family when it is an o'clock time.

Adding Number Sentence - try to write add number sentences, using your toys, e.g. 5 + 3 = 8, remember to use your toys to help you.

Write takeaway number sentences - start with 10 toys, then take 1 away, 10-1=9, start at 10 again, this time take a different number away, repeat.

**Interest writing** - have you been for a walk, baked, watched a favourite film, made a model, enjoyed a favourite book, dressed up, enjoy writing about something that you have done.

## Reading

If you can, look on YouTube and find - the story of 'Barry the Fish with Fingers.' Read and discuss with an adult, draw and describe Barry and the other fish. Write sentences to describe Barry and his fish friends, remember to chop up the words to help you write.

Reread and talk about what Barry could do with his fingers, write a sentence telling everyone what Barry could do.

Write about your favourite part of the story.
