The days are coming, the prophet Jeremiah says, when the Lord will raise a virtuous branch for David and he will save Judah, and the exiled people will once again live in their own land. In Jeremiah 23:5-8 we have the famous beautiful phrase 'In his days justice shall flourish and peace till the moon fails.'

Reading Matthew 1:18-24 we see the fulfilment of the prophecy of Jeremiah. Joseph is told about the conception of Mary's child, and that he is to name him Jesus. Through that charity which bound you to the Immaculate Virgin Mother of God and through the paternal love with which you embraced the Child Jesus, we humbly beg you graciously to regard the inheritance which Jesus Christ has purchased by his Blood, and with your power and strength to aid us in our necessities. O most watchful guardian of the Holy Family, defend the chosen children of Jesus Christ; O most loving father, ward off from us every contagion of error and corrupting influence; As once you rescued the Child Jesus from deadly peril, so now protect God's Holy Church from the snares of the enemy and from all adversity; shield, too, each one of us by your constant protection, so that, supported by your example and your aid,

we may be able to live piously, to die in holiness, and to obtain eternal happiness in heaven. Amen.

And our beautiful 'O' Antiphon: 'O Adonai and leader of the house of Israel, you appeared to Moses in a burning bush and you gave him the Law on Sinai. 0 come and save us with your mighty power.'

For a hymn today let us 'Sing Of Mary, Pure And Lowly In the House Of Nazareth,' as Joseph was definitely there in the house too. I always think this song should have a verse about Joseph – maybe one day I'll get around to having a crack at writing one.
