We continue our passages from the wonderfully consoling Prophet Hosea. We must try to have genuine love and repentance which will not disappear like the morning dew. We have the important message in Hosea 5:15-6:6 'What I want is love, not sacrifice, knowledge of God, not holocausts.' Perhaps in the times of Pandemic when we were in full lookdown, and couldn't hold our masses and services God was calling us to look for other ways to truly show his love to the world. I'd like to think we did. But I'll let God be the judge of that.

And that message from Hosea is reflected in Luke 18:9-14 in which Jesus gives us the parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector, the Pharisee's prayer being self-serving and arrogant, while the Tax Collector humbly comes before the Lord, acknowledging his sinfulness. Let us hope all our Lenten observances, especially our prayer, are done in a spirit of humility and love, 'For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the man who humbles himself will be exalted.'

We pray for the heart position of humility.

Humility in such a way that we do not cheapen our own worth or value within,

but that we take the alignment that we are here for a greater purpose than just our own gain.

We pray that You will highlight to us what it truly means to live a humble life and that our own worth will be revealed by Your Light.

It is only then that we may truly live in freedom and right standing,

for we will hold our own value correctly.

Lord, we welcome You to mould and secure our hearts in true humility by Your lead.

Through Christ our Lord. Amen.
