School Bags - A school book bag is compulsory for	Year Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. If you child is

Jewellery – Apart from wrist watches, jewellery should not be worn. If a child's ears have been							
pierced, only small plain studs should be worn, but while participating in in swimming or PE, this child							
will not be able to wear any type of ear adornment for safety reasons. Parents who allow their child							
to have an ear/s pierced during term time or immediately before the start of term, will effectively							
exclude that child from the curriculum activities identified above.							
Hair - Hair must be neat and tidy. Long hair must be tied back. Extreme hairstyles are not							
permitted. Large decorative hair accessories are also unacceptable i.e. larger bows, flowers,							
headbands with ears.							
Birthdays – If a child's birthday lands on a school day only, they may wear their own clothes on that							
day.
