Science

Living Things – Children will learn the parts of a flowering plant and learn about sexual and asexual reproduction in plants. They will learn the life cycles of a mammal, amphibian, insect and bird and research a famous biologist.

Animals including Humans – Children will draw a timeline to indicate stages in the growth and development of humans and describe the changes as humans develop to old age.

Children will research the gestation periods of other animals and compare them with humans; by finding out and recording the length and mass of a baby as it grows.

History

The Ancient Greeks - Children will locate Greece on a map and learn about its physical and human features. They will develop their understanding of life in Ancient Greece by studying how states were ruled and the similarities between Athens and Sparta which were two powerful states at the time. They will look at Greek armies and the battle of Marathon. Children will understand how Greek life has influenced our culture today through language and architecture.

RHE

Here we explore how human beings are relational by nature and are called to love others in the wider community through service, through dialogue and through working for the Common Good. Pupils will develop understanding and appreciation of the three-part community of love, the Trinity, with the endpoint of discussing the Trinity as it might be communicated in a church setting. Children will learn that the Trinity demonstrates the perfect loving community, and we are called to emulate this self-giving and self-sacrificing love in our communities. This learning will help them to fulfil their purpose of making a difference in the world around them.

Games/PE

Games, swimming and PE are compulsory subjects as part of the National Curriculum and children are required to take part in all of these. Please ensure that your child has the correct kit needed. If for any reason they cannot take part, they MUST have a written note. No jewellery to be worn.
