Dear Parents/Carers,

I am writing to officially inform you that we have a confirmed case of **COVID-19** that may have an impact on your child's class – **Year 2**.

As you know from my previous letters, the latest guidance states that:

From 16 August, the Government has said that people aged under 18 years and 6 months or who are fully vaccinated will **no longer be legally required to isolate if they are a close contact of someone with COVID-19**.

As a school, we consider the whole class to be '**close contacts**' as staff and children socialise with each other throughout the day. Local Public Health guidance strongly advises you to take your child for a PCR test so we can all help break the train of transmission (but not a legal requirement); this can be arranged after school. Children do not need to self-isolate until they receive their PCR test result – advisable - but this is still a personal choice.

Please can I ask you to inform school, by email, whether you have chosen to take your child or not for the test and the result of the test.
