

## SUBJECT: Drama Curriculum Map

Rationale	Students can use drama to become another person and explore a new role. Pupils will learn to communicate, listen and make agreements in a safe environment where the drama, actions and consequences can be discussed and experienced as a true collective.

Knowledge	Pupils will have an under- standing of basic drama skills; group work, listening skills, sharing of ideas, performing a role, freeze frames. Pupils will work in varying group sizes to develop the skills above, building on peer relationships and confidence. Each lesson will build on the level of performance skill to demon- strate focus, concentration and imagination within a role play. The baseline will result in an end performance of a TV advert where pupils will focus on 5 main areas: persuasion, narration, jingles, slogans and entertainment.	Pupils will work from a story as their stimulus. Pupils will use their imagina- tions to create their own devised pieces of drama based on the stimulus and Teacher in Role. Characterisation skills during role play will be further dev- eloped by deeper ex- ploration of the roles as lessons are sequenced for storytelling. Pupils will use key words such as tension, surprise and atmosphere in creating their theatre.	Pupils will work practically on developing their own slapstick routines. This is the first time pupils will work in sequence to create an 'end performance' in a pair. Pupils will study profession al works as a stimulus. Pupils will work on the technique of mime and complete structured piece with an incident, chase, fight and an ending. Pupils will take part in verbal evaluations that will be teacher led and involve key vocabulary for the first time.	Pupils will work from a story as a stimulus. Pupils will learn about morals and apply them to the given story and their own lives. Pupils will use their imagination to create scenes linking to morals and our society. Pupils should now be able to stay in role during perform- ances and characters should be believable and naturalistic. Key vocabulary will be used as part of verbal evalua- tion.	Pupils will learn about musical theatre and how it is formed with a mixture of dance, drama and music. Pupils will study a variety of scripts/texts and scenes and work on developing a piece for final assessment. This is their first attempt at script work and creating a performance from a given role and stage directions.	Pupils will read from, perform from and devise from the text (using all elements of GCSE Drama for the first time). Pupils will use extracts of the text, learn their lines and perform the text. Pupils will also improvise/d evise from a text using scenes as a stimulus for creating the drama.

Assess- ments	Pupils will be assessed on their ability to work from the stimulus to produce freeze frames relating to the story. This will show their under- standing of playing a drama role. Pupils will be assessed on their ability to work effectively in a group, listen to others and focus during rehearsal time. Pupils will evaluate their own drama using key vocabulary from the TV advert task.	Pupils will be assessed on their ability to perform a role from a given story. Pupils will be assessed on devised scenes created from the stimulus. Pupils will show good imagination and creativity in their scenes with a clear understanding of the themes of tension, atmosphere and surprise. Pupils will be assessed on their ability to perform new skills.	Pupils will be assessed on their develop- ment and performance of the comedy routines. They will be assessed on how they perform the stereotype characters, the comedy incident, the chase and the ending. Pupils should show their development by using pro- fessional works as a stimulus.
