Rationale	Dramatic exploration can provide students with an outlet for emotions, thoughts, and problem solving that they might not otherwise have means to express. Year 8 Drama is about the exploration of topics that look at social and emotional development and intelligence so that pupils can learn through practical group sessions and performance from a range of stimuli such as poems, scripts and historical real-life stories.

Knowledge	Pupils will learn to explore a PSHE topic and use practical exploration to look at social and emotional elements of bullying. Pupils will learn about the different types of bullying with a focus on cyber bullying. Pupils will explore the genre 'Theatre in Education' and use this to create theatre that informs and educates its audience.	Pupils will study this text and will learn to perform the script itself and use the text as a stimulus. Pupils will learn to take on roles from the text and learn lines in preparation for performance. Pupils will learn to read between the lines and create imaginative scenes that are improvised from the stimulus. Pupils will learn to use the emotive theme of the play to help create their drama. Pupils will become familiar with the layout of a play script and how to use its stage directions to create scenes.	Pupils will study a different stimuli each lesson exploring the exaggerated drama form: melodrama. Students will learn about the history of melodrama, learn about real life stories, poems and historical events during this scheme of work.	Pupils will extend their knowledge of melodramatic performance styles by studying the format of soap opera. Pupils will learn about the history of soap opera on UK television and the format of a build up to a dramatic event with sub-plots. Pupils will learn to include stereotypical characters, storylines, plots and themes to create their own soap opera.	Pupils will study a variety of musical theatre scenes. Pupils will learn to use visual examples/model ling to create their own versions of the scenes. Pupils will learn about the combination of arts disciplines and how to sequence these skills to build a polished performance. Pupils will learn to use character analysis to play a role believably.
