Dear Parent/Carer

Firstly, I would like to **thank you** all for the tremendous support that you have given to the school in these unusual and challenging times. Following the Government announcement last night, it is apparent that pupils in Years 7, 8 and 9 will not be returning to school before September. Our Year 10 pupils may return for a number of weeks before the planned summer holiday, depending upon the conditions. If and when this happens, I will write to parents and pupils of Year 10 with the details of how the school will open.

However, we do still have 9 school weeks of the summer term left to operate under the same home learning environment. I realise that working under these conditions has been really challenging, all the teaching staff and I massively appreciate the superb efforts of our pupils and parents.

It has been fantastic to read and see some of the fantastic work and projects that pupils have been completing at home. Please continue to send us your stories and photographs of your work so that we can tweet these brilliant efforts. As long as every pupil is doing their best that is all we would ever ask for.

Hopefully you will be aware of the 'Kilometre Challenge' and how it galvanised our pupils a couple of weeks ago. I would like to thank the PE Department for their efforts and **congratulations** to the pupils for beating the staff!

I would now like you to please put a date in your diary for another school community event - Wednesday at 7.00pm when we will be holding a Music Concert which we would like you all to access the school website to watch.
